Maritime Delimitation in the Black Sea (Romania v. Ukraine)

Extension of time-limit for the filing of Ukraine's Rejoinder

THE HAGUE, 11 June 2007. The International Court of Justice (ICJ) has extended the time-limit for the submission of Ukraine's Rejoinder in the case concerning <u>Maritime Delimitation</u> in the Black Sea (Romania v. <u>Ukraine</u>).

In its Order dated 8 June 2007, the Court fixed 6 July 2007 as the time-limit for the filing of that written pleading.

In a letter dated 31 May 2007, the Agent of Ukraine had asked the Court to postpone until 6 July 2007, the time-limit for the filing of Ukraine's Rejoinder. By a letter dated 4 June 2007, the Agent of Romania stated that his Government "[did] not oppose a reasonable extension, provided that it [would] not influence upon the fixing of the oral hearings".

The Court adopted the above-mentioned Order taking account of the views of the Parties.
