SECTION A.—REQUEST FOR ADVISORY OPINION

I.—THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL OF THE UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATION TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE

[Translation]

19 Avenue Kléber, Paris XVI, November 30th, 1955.

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Executive Board of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, by a resolution adopted at its 42nd session on November 18th, 1955, acting within the framework of Article XII of the Statute of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation, decided to challenge the decisions rendered by the Tribunal on April 26th, 1955, in the Leff, Duberg and Wilcox cases and on October 29th, 1955, in the Bernstein case, and to refer the question of their validity to the International Court of Justice.

Accordingly, the Executive Board of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, by a resolution adopted at its 42nd session on November 25th, 1955, decided to request the International Court of Justice to give an advisory opinion on the following questions:

- "Having regard to the Statute of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation;
 - Having regard to the Staff Regulations and Staff Rules of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, and to any other relevant texts;
 - Having regard to the contracts of appointment of Messrs. Duberg and Leff and Mrs. Wilcox and Mrs. Bernstein;
 - I.—Was the Administrative Tribunal competent, under Article
 II of its Statute, to hear the complaints introduced against
 the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural

- (a) Was the Administrative Tribunal competent to determine whether the power of the Director-General not to renew fixed-term appointments has been exercised for the good of the service and in the interest of the Organization?
- (b) Was the Administrative Tribunal competent to pronounce on the attitude which the Director-General, under the terms of the Constitution of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, ought to maintain in his relations with a Member State, particularly as regards the execution of the policy of the Government authorities of that Member State?
- III.—In any case, what is the validity of the decisions given by the Administrative Tribunal in its Judgments Nos. 17, 18, 19 and 21?"

One copy each of the French and English texts of the latter resolution of the Executive Board of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, both duly certified, are herein enclosed.

In accordance with Article 65 of the Statute of the International Court of Justice, I shall transmit to the Court all documents likely to throw light upon the question.

II.—RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATION, AT ITS 42ND SESSION, ON 25 NOVEMBER 1955

The Executive Board,

Whereas, by its Judgments Nos. 17, 18 and 19 of 26 April 1955, and No. 21 of 29 October 1955, the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation confirmed its jurisdiction in the complaints introduced by Messrs. Duberg and Leff and Mrs. Wilcox and Mrs. Bernstein against the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization,

Whereas Article XII of the Statute of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation provides as follows:

- "I. In any case in which the Executive Board of an international organization which has made the declaration specified in Article II, paragraph 5, of the Statute of the Tribunal challenges a decision of the Tribunal confirming its jurisdiction, or considers that a decision of the Tribunal is vitiated by a fundamental fault in the procedure followed, the question of the validity of the decision given by the Tribunal shall be submitted by the Executive Board concerned, for an advisory opinion, to the International Court of Justice.
 - 2. The opinion given by the Court shall be binding."

Whereas the Executive Board, after consideration, wishes to avail itself of the provisions of the said Article,

Decides to submit the following legal questions to the International Court of Justice for an advisory opinion:

Having regard to the Statute of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation;

Having regard to the Staff Regulations and Staff Rules of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, and to any other relevant texts;

Having regard to the contracts of appointment of Messrs. Duberg and Leff and Mrs. Wilcox and Mrs. Bernstein:

I.—Was the Administrative Tribunal competent, under Article II of its Statute, to hear the complaints introduced against the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization on 5 February 1955 by Messrs. Duberg and Leff and Mrs. Wilcox, and on 28 June 1955 by Mrs. Bernstein?

II.—In the case of an affirmative answer to question I:

- (a) Was the Administrative Tribunal competent to determine whether the power of the Director-General not to renew fixed-term appointments has been exercised for the good of the service and in the interest of the Organization?
- (b) Was the Administrative Tribunal competent to pronounce on the attitude which the Director-General, under the terms of the Constitution of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, ought to maintain in his relations with a Member State, particularly as regards the execution of the policy of the Government authorities of that Member State?

III.—In any case, what is the validity of the decisions given by the Administrative Tribunal in its Judgments Nos. 17, 18, 19 and 21?

Introduction

- 1. The present documentation contains, in three dossiers, the documents likely to throw light upon the questions which have been submitted to the International Court of Justice for an advisory opinion, by a resolution, dated 25 November 1955, of the Executive Board of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization. These documents are certified to be either official records or true copies therefrom, or true copies of the documents submitted to the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organization and of the stenographic record of the sittings of the said Tribunal and they are transmitted to the Court by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization in accordance with Article 65 of the Statute of the Court.
- 2. Each document or extract therefrom is identified by title and, where applicable, official symbol of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, of the League of Nations or of the International Labour Organisation. Wherever possible, citation is also given to the volume and page where the document may be found in the official records of these Organizations. In addition to the official identification the documents, for convenience in use, have been numbered consecutively in the order in which they appear in the documentation. A complete list of the documents is found in the table of contents.
 - 3. This documentation consists of eight sections as follows:
 - I. Constitutional texts;
 - II. Agreement between the United Nations and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization;
 - III. Records relating to the recognition by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization of the competence of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organization

- IV. Records of the 42nd session of the Executive Board relating to the adoption of the resolution of 25 November 1955 requesting an advisory opinion;
 - V. Statute of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation and other relevant instruments;
 - VI. Records relating to the creation of the Administrative Tribunal of the League of Nations;
- VII. Records of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation;
- VIII. Dossiers of the Du Berg, Leff, Wilcox and Bernstein cases before the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation.
- 4. Section I contains texts of the Constitution of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization in force prior to and following the adoption of amendments to the Constitution by the General Conference at its eighth session held at Montevideo in November-December 1954.
- 5. Section II contains an extract of the Agreement between the United Nations and Unesco reproducing the text of the Article thereof dealing with the relations of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization with the International Court of Justice.
- 6. Section III contains official records bearing on the recognition by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization of the competence of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation. Documents numbers (5), (9) and (11) are notes submitted by the Director-General to the Executive Board and the General Conference. Documents numbers (4), (6), (10) and (12) contain the texts of the various resolutions adopted on the subject by the Executive Board and the General Conference and documents numbers (7), (8), (13) and (14) reproduce the texts of letters exchanged for that purpose between the International Labour Organisation and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.
- 7. Section IV contains the documents (including summary records, reports and decisions) of the 42nd session of the Executive Board of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization which concern the adoption by the Board of the resolution of 25 November 1955. Documents (15) and (16) contain the summary record of the fourteenth and twenty-fifth meetings of the Executive Board at which the matter was considered. Documents numbers (17) and (19) deal with the communication to Members of the Executive Board of the texts of the judgments rendered

ordinary session of the General Conference. These documents deal with such questions as the application to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization of Executive Orders of the President of the United States of America, provisions of Staff Regulations concerning standards of integrity, common personnel policy of the United Nations and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, obligations and rights of staff members, personnel recruitment standards and methods, etc.

- 9. Section VI of the documentation contains documents relating to the creation of the Administrative Tribunal of the League of Nations. It contains the texts of the various draft statutes which resulted in the creation in 1927 of the Administrative Tribunal of the League of Nations, the statute of which became in 1946 the Statute of the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation. Documents numbers (57) to (69) are reports and minutes of meetings of the Supervisory Commission of the League of Nations which was entrusted with the preliminary studies on the establishment of an Administrative Tribunal; documents numbers (70) to (72) relate to the proceedings of the Fourth Committee of the Assembly and document number (73) to the proceedings of the Assembly which adopted the Statute in plenary meeting.
- 10. Section VII gives the texts of the judgments rendered by the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation from 1947 to 1955, including judgments numbers 17, 18, 19 and 21 which gave rise to the questions submitted to the Court. The texts of judgments numbers 17, 18 and 19 are also found in annex to a document submitted to the Executive Board and which constitutes document number (17). The complete series is contained in documents numbers (74) to (97).
- II. Section VIII of the documentation contains the complete dossiers of the Du Berg, Leff, Wilcox and Bernstein cases as they were submitted to the Administrative Tribunal of the International Labour Organisation. The Du Berg, Leff and Wilcox dossiers were submitted to the Administrative Tribunal at the first part of its fifth session in April 1955, the Bernstein dossier at the second part of the same session in October 1955. The written complaints instituting proceedings, together with the accompanying documentation, are found in documents numbers (98) to (108). Each complaint submitted was accompanied by an individual documentation. In addition, a general documentation was submitted to the Administrative Tribunal at each of the two parts of the session at which the cases were considered. The statements submitted by the Organization in reply to the four complaints are

submitted in these cases by Mr. Pierre Henquet, President of the Staff Association of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization. In documents (115) and (116) will be found the stenographic records of the oral proceedings before the Administrative Tribunal in the four cases. These records which have been taken on behalf of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization are unofficial in character and do not constitute official records of the Administrative Tribunal; Section VIII also contains documents constituting the terms of appointment of the four complainants. These documents, numbers (117) to (120), relate to the original appointments, the prolongation of the contracts and the expiration of the contracts of the complainants.

12. In addition to the documents transmitted to the Court in the present documentation, copies of the judgments rendered by the Administrative Tribunal of the League of Nations during the years 1929-1946 and which form part of the historical background of the questions submitted to the Court have been sent for the files of the Registry of the Court. The texts of these judgments exist in French only.
