Communiqué No. 62/13

The following information from the Registry of the International Court of Justice is communicated to the Press:

In the course of 8 hearings from Monday 14 May to Saturday 19 May, 1962, in the Advisory Opinion in the matter of Financial Obligations of Members of the United Nations (Article 17, paragraph 2, of the Charter), the Court heard the following:

The next hearing will be held on Monday, 21 May, at 10.30 a.m., at which time the Court will hear Mr. G.I. Tunkin, Professor, Director of the Juridical-Treaty Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, on behalf of the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and the Honorable Abram Chayes, Legal Adviser, Department of State, on behalf of the Government of the United States of America.
