Communiqué No. 50/27. Unofficial.

The following information from the Registry of the International Court of Justice has been communicated to the press:

On Wednesday, June 28th, the hearings continued in the second phase of the advisory case concerning the Interpretation of Peace Treaties with Bulgaria, Hungary and Romania. The representative of the Government of the United Kingdom, Mr. G. G. Fitzmaurice, continued and concluded his oral statement begun at the end of yesterday's sitting.

In presenting the views of his Government, Mr. Fitzmaurice relied <u>inter alia</u> upon the Opinion delivered by the International Court of Justice on March 30th, 1950, in the first phase of the same case, considerations of a general legal and doctrinal character and the actual wording of the arbitration clauses of the Peace Treaties. He concluded by requesting the Court to give an affirmative answer to Questions III and IV.
