# Case concerning the Land and Maritime Boundary between Cameroon and Nigeria

(Cameroon v. Nigeria)

#### Request for the indication of provisional measures

Hearings to open on 5 March 1996

The following information is communicated to the Press by the Registry of the International Court of Justice:

Public sittings to hear the oral arguments of the Parties in the above case on the request for the indication of provisional measures, made by Cameroon on 12 February 1996 (see attached Press Communiqué No. 96/5), will open at 10 a.m. on Tuesday 5 March 1996, in the Great Hall of Justice of the Peace Palace at The Hague. The hearings are expected to conclude on Friday, 8 March 1996.

#### NOTE FOR THE PRESS

- 1. The public sittings will be held in the Great Hall of Justice of the Peace Palace. Members of the Press will be entitled to attend on presentation of an admission card, which may be obtained upon application. The tables reserved for them are situated on the far left of the public entrance of the courtroom.
- 2. Photographs may be taken before the opening, during the first five minutes of the sitting; and also for a few minutes towards the end. Filming for cinema or television purposes is however subject to special authorization.
- 3. In the Press Room, located on the ground floor of the Peace Palace (Room 5), the Court's proceedings will be relayed through a loudspeaker.
- 4. Members of the Press who wish to make phone calls may use the public telephones in the Post Office in the basement of the Palace.
