Mister Registar,

With reference to your letter n. 95586 dated 8th February 1995, please take note of the following:

The Republic of San Marino affirms that the existence of nuclear weapons and their proliferation represents a serious threat to peace and reaffirms the need for the International Court of Justice to express an advisory opinion on "Legality of the threat or use of nuclear weapons". The Republic of San Marino in fact considers it as a violation of the United Nations Charter and of any national and international rule protecting human rights, as stated by the Resolution 49/75 K., adopted by the General Assembly in its 90th plenary session of December 15th, 1994.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of San Marino wishes to know any decision that the International Court of Justice will adopt on this matter.

I shall be grateful if you could give instructions on the above-mentioned position of San Marino and I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to you, Mister Registar, the assurance of my highest consideration.
